Course contents

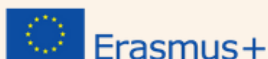
This course introduces participants to Project-Based Learning (PBL), providing a deep understanding of launching an international project. The course covers the entire life cycle of a project, from the initial idea, finding a partner and negotiating with them, designing a common project, to implementation. It looks at the principles of project work and collaboration, and the educational use of various ICT tools. Throughout this course, eTwinning is used as a resource for information, tools and inspiration to implementing PBL.
