Activities for projects | Set 1: Online security and critical thinking in the digital era.

Contraseñas seguras Secure Passwords



Ages: 6 - 9 years old



Difficulty: Intermediate



Duration: 7 sessions



Tags: Secure passwords, online security and safety

DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

The students of all the schools reflect on the characteristics needed for secure passwords and establish some basic rules that all passwords must comply with. One partner school uses a specific artistic technique to instruct another partner on how to come up with a password, following one or two of the rules. Collaborative posters are created with all the resulting products to share with the school community.

OBJECTIVES

- To learn how to create and use strong passwords in order to protect personal data
- To promote collaborative work with students from different partner countries and make good use of digital tools
- To further develop creativity through different outputs and artistic expressions, while building the foundation for creating visual and audiovisual proposals.

EXPECTED FINAL PRODUCTS / RESULTS

Posters that are made jointly and collaboratively that include messages about using secure passwords, as well as some examples to disseminate throughout the school community.

CARRYING OUT THE ACTIVITY

PRIOR PREPARATION

Phase 1. Creation of the TwinSpace

Teachers set up an online meeting to establish the work criteria and schedule and the digital tools that the students will use to work together.

Teachers create the TwinSpace pages that will be used for this activity. In this case, six pages are proposed:

- 1. Introducing ourselves
- 2. What is a secure password?
- 3. Working in international teams
- 4. Safe and artistic collaborative posters
- 5. Assessment
- 6. Dissemination

Phase 2. Invitation for the students to access the TwinSpace.

Teachers register their students on the TwinSpace.

Phase 3. Creation of Forum debates

In the "Forum" section, teachers start a debate so that students can introduce themselves and interact.

IMPLEMENTATION

Phase 1. Getting familiar with TwinSpace and introducing ourselves (1 session)

Teachers help students get familiar with the different TwinSpace areas and explain the joint activities they will carry out with their partners.

Students edit their profiles with a copyright-free image to ensure their privacy (www.pixabay.com).

Once the students are registered on the TwinSpace, they introduce themselves (with the guidance of their teacher), in the dedicated Forum thread, by adding a very simple post and briefly introducing themselves using their names and a greeting. This step can be done by everyone at the same time on their computers or tablets while the teacher provides an example on the digital whiteboard.

Phase 2. Learning about online security and secure passwords (1 session)

The teacher invites an expert to the classroom to give a talk on the Internet and online security, specifically on the topic of secure passwords.

The teacher can contact the Police or the <u>Master Plan for the Coexistence and Security Improvement in Schools and Educational Environments</u>, organized by the Spanish Ministry of Interior.

Phase 3. Working in international teams (2 sessions)

A videoconference is organized (in which all the partner schools are asked to participate) to share what has been learned from the previous talk related to creating secure passwords. Ideas about these basic rules are gathered and shared on the TwinSpace.

Teachers organize students into international teams. Using TwinSpace, one classroom group will send another class from another country two guidelines that will be used to come up with a secure password, along with instructions as to which artistic technique should be used.

Example: Team 1 instructs Team 2 on how to make strong passwords using numbers and capital letters, using a stippling technique with markers.

Team 2 creates this password: JiO8890aeo (with each character colored and dotted).

Phase 4. Safe and artistic collaborative posters (1 session)

Students, with the help of their teacher, upload all the passwords created in their international teams to a digital collaborative board (eg. Padlet), as well as to the MATERIALS section of the TwinSpace, so that hard copy collaborative posters can be printed.

ASSESSMENT

The students carry out an assessment of the activity using Quizizz, Kahoot (or other similar digital tools) to check what they have learned from online and digital content related to strong and secure passwords.

The teachers hold a videoconference session to carry out the assessment of the activity and analyze the results of the students' assessment to propose areas of improvement and discuss any possible difficulties that came up during the activity.

Copies of these brochures will be provided to the participating students' families, to the rest of the student body and to local institutions (such as the municipal library, the town hall, the cultural center, etc).
