

## Set II

¿Qué noticias te gustaría leer?  
What type of news do you like to read?



**Ages:** 15 – 18 years old



**Difficulty:** intermediate



**4 partners**



**Duration:** 8 sessions



**Tags:** news, attribution, media literacy, disinformation

### DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY:

Students create a newspaper with fake news that they would like to see published in a media outlet, giving it a humorous touch. After analyzing how to structure good fake news and what reasons an author may have for spreading it, students work in international teams to write the news story and publish it.

### OBJECTIVES:

1. To analyze why fake news spreads faster and reaches more people than stories that are true
2. To understand that fake news and misleading information aren't mere coincidences and that there is some type of motivation behind disinformation
3. To structure a story following the journalist's guide of the *5W* (*Who, What, When, Where and Why*)

## CURRICULAR CONTENT:

## INCLUSIVITY:

Students come up with news stories in a creative and open way, developing creativity and a sense of belonging through cultural and artistic expression, the use of empathy and a collaborative attitude, and the acceptance of diversity as a basis of coexistence.

## EXPECTED FINAL PRODUCTS / RESULTS:

- Collaborative newspaper filled with fake news

## CARRYING OUT THE ACTIVITY



### Preparation

**Step 1:** The participating teachers create a profile for each student in the TwinSpace.

## THE NEWS WE'D LIKE TO READ

- Getting responses from the readers. We want them to hit the button and share the news.
- You need fictional stories that people want to be true.
- Will your story surprise or shock the reader?
- Use the 5 Ws: **WHO** is involved? **WHAT** and **WHEN** does the action take place? **WHERE** is happening and **WHY**?

**TASK 0** Write the beginning of a story

**TASK 1**

- Read your partners' story and complete it.
- Add a **HEADING** and a free **PICTURE** that will complement the story. Mention the source.

**TASK 2**

Share the structure of a good, fake piece of news. Your partners will write the story:

- HEADLINE
- WHO
- WHAT
- WHEN?
- WHY?

### Step 3: Coming up with the news

Teachers ask students, in international teams, to come up with news stories in two different ways. Firstly, students from one school start a story and another team from a different school finishes it, proposes a title and adds a photograph using a copyright-free image resource bank. Secondly, all of the students from one of the participating schools proposes a headline, an outline of the news using the five "Ws" (Who, What, When, Where and Why) and a photograph that inspires the team in charge of narrating the story in the partner school.

### Step 4: Organizing the task in international teams

Teachers add a shared document on this page to organize the creation of the news stories. In this document, they indicate who will start the story, who continues writing, as well as a link to each story's document. The participating teachers distribute the students into teams, keeping in mind the students' interests and abilities as regards to the topics proposed for the stories.

## THE NEWS YOU'D LIKE TO READ

**NEWSPAPER CHART**

Please add who starts the news, who continues the story and the link to the document. Check permissions to give access to the document.

Each school starts two or more pieces of news and shares them via link to the document. When the first parts are in the chart, each school picks up TWO from another partner, writes their name in the chart so everyone knows they are working on it, and finishes it.

- Share 5 Ws and it will be finished by a partner
- Start a story and it will be finished by a partner

When it's all ready (hopefully by the end of the 1st week of June) Bilyana's students will put it all in a digital publication as a newspaper.

We started a draft of the newspaper at Koldo Mixelena. Hope it helps. The pieces of news in green have already been added.
